WELCOME TO PERINS SCHOOL

Perins School is situated in the Market town of Alresford, set in a 23 acre site. Thanks to the local philanthropist Henry Perin, Perins School has been educating the youth of Alresford for over 300 years and is one of the oldest schools in Hampshire.

Henry Perin died in 1696 leaving funds in his will to build a school in Alresford to educate "19 poor men's sons." the school was founded in 1698.

Perins' history reflects the progression of education through the ages, today Perins School is an Academy for students aged 11-16 with 1,150 students on roll. Perins converted to academy status in August 2011 and in September 2017 Perins became sponsors of Sun Hill Junior School, forming The Perins Multi-Academy Trust (MAT).



TEACHING & LEARNING AT PERINS

At Perins, we believe that strong, consistent levels of good teaching and learning, providing skills that develop students' independence in learning are at the very heart of what we do.

We consistently provide excellent levels of CPD for all our staff, including teaching staff, which aims to keep our practices up to date with current pedagogical thinking in the teaching world, and all our staff contribute towards developments in teaching and learning at the school. Ultimately, this is how we develop the very best teaching for our students.

Key to this over a number of years has been the development of practices that ensure that students have the opportunity to revisit skills and topics over the five years that they are with us. This predominantly comes in two forms; through our "spiral" curriculum, which means that students have the opportunity to build upon what

they learn year on year, as well as a whole school consistent approach to "retrieval practice", with students given the continuous opportunity to revisit learning from lesson to lesson, from week to week, and from term to term. This focus on repetition of learning is fundamental to students' ability to develop, retain, embed and deepen their knowledge and understanding in all subjects across the school.

Key to this over a number of years has been the development of practices that ensure that students have the opportunity to revisit skills and topics over the five years that they are with us.

Our staff choose to go the extra mile and our extra-curricular offer is second to none.




SOUTH AFRICA SPORTS TOUR:

Every two years Year 11 and Year 10 students have the opportunity to participate in the Perins Sports Tour of South Africa. This exciting venture is the product of two years of training and fundraising for both students and teachers and creates lifelong memories for all.

The students have the opportunity to compete against different schools and colleges while traveling around the country and the opportunity to interact with the people of South Africa by running sport specific workshops in the Townships. When the students are not competing they have plenty of time to experience the beauty of South Africa.

WORKING TOGETHER

Our relationship with you makes a valuable contribution to your child's education, we use a number of methods to keep you up to date with your child's progress and school news.

Every parent has access to an app which allows you to access your child's homework, behaviour and achievement records as well as their timetable information.

We hold annual parents evening with subject teachers and progress reports are sent home regularly. If you have any concerns regarding progress your child's tutor will be able to help in most instances.

We also provide you with practical help to support your child by offering information evenings, ranging from the Year 8 Options fair to effective revision strategies for year 11 students.

Regular school bulletins, our school website as well as our social media channels are also ways to keep in touch with school life. We also hold parent focus groups where parents and members of our Senior Leadership team discuss a number of school related issues that help to shape and contribute to school decision making.

OUR PASTORAL SYSTEM

We are proud of our pastoral system .We recognise that sometimes for whatever reason, life at school may become a challenge, at Perins we foster a caring and supportive environment throughout the school. Thanks to our specialised student services team, we benefit from being able to identify and address any concerns as they arise.

Our team consists of non-teaching staff, including Guidance managers and Heads of House whose primary role is to ensure the welfare of your child, supporting your child's social, wellbeing and mental health needs. Our philosophy towards well-being is reflected in our support for students and staff to adopt effective physical, mental and spiritual strategies and practices.

By understanding that well-being is achieved when the mind, body and spirit are in synergy, the individual will be equipped to adapt to life's challenges and compromises with confidence and self-belief.

SUPPORTING OUR STUDENTS' INDIVIDUAL NEEDS

Perins is proud to be an inclusive school. We believe every students' needs are individual and therefore it is our aim to understand and help all of our students reach their full potential by removing any barriers that could hinder their progress.

By getting to know our students and through reading and literacy screening in year 7 we can help to support their educational journey, whether that includes focussed 1:1 support, smaller group work or in class interventions. Our Special Educational needs department work closely with each student requiring additional support and support teachers in delivering 'Quality first teaching.'

Every student is entitled to enjoy the full curriculum, regardless of additional requirements, and we do our very best to try to meet each pupil's individual needs. Support for students with SEND is the responsibility of every teacher at Perins.

As well as working to remove learning barriers, we also have a well established 'More able and talented' scheme which aims to enrich and extend the learning experience of the more able students at the school.



OUR LAPTOP SCHEME

We are very proud of our pioneering Laptop scheme. All students are given the opportunity to use a school laptop for their time at Perins for use in school and at home.

The scheme relies on the commitment and donations of our parents to ensure we can deliver this outstanding opportunity to our students.







- The use of computers in schools is known to promote independent learning which the students find empowering and our excellent academic results demonstrate its effect.
- Increased engagement and interest for students to learn interactively
- More effective diagnostic testing for students and staff; electronic tests with immediate feedback
- Online student collaboration, modelling and peer assessment to improve grades

- Ease of sharing work and learning from each other
- Regular and frequent exposure to relevant technology in all subject areas, as opposed to once a week in an IT suite

We believe in integrating digital learning, with technology as a complementary piece of equipment in a student's "pencil case" which supports and develops different skills, alongside the more traditional approaches of reading, writing, drafting, spelling and drawing traditionally practised in schools.

OUR HOUSE SYSTEM:

At the start of your child's journey at Perins, every student and staff member is assigned a house where they remain for the duration of their school life. Our House system creates competition, promotes good work and behaviour, encourages teamwork, provides opportunities

Each tutor group belongs to one of our School Houses Ventus, Ignis, Terra and Aqua, they stand for VITA, which is the Latin for 'Life.' Our Heads of Houses and their deputies maintain an overview of academic progress, achievements and behaviour.

The house system praises the students for their academic to take on responsibilities and brings everyone in the school together. and extra-curricular success, charitable work and pride and ownership across the school, as well as creating friendly competition between houses.


MY FIRST YEAR AT PERINS


